*The steel and barbed wire fence that separates the U.S. and Mexico will become a powerful symbol again this year—not of division, but of unity and solidarity as pilgrims on both sides of the border will meet in Nogales to re-enact, with music and prayers "La Posada" or journey of Mary and Joseph as they went from house to house, seeking shelter and hospitality on the first Christmas. The ceremony is designed to strengthen social, religious, economic and cultural bonds in both countries and to counter the virulent anti-immigrant sentiment that currently permeates the atmosphere.*

**Directions to Nogales**

*(from Tucson)*

I-19 South to Nogales.

I-19 becomes N. Sonita as you enter town. Turn right on W. Crawford.

**Parking**

We recommend you park at one of the lots on N. Sonita, just before you get to Crawford or at the McDonalds lot on Crawford and walk the short distance to the Posada. There is no parking at the site of the Posada.

The Posada**

Cross Grand Avenue at Park St. Immediately after you cross the Southern Pacific railroad tracks you will turn right onto N. Robbins. It is a one-way street going south (toward the border wall). It dead ends in International Street. The Posada is held on E International Street between N. Robbins and the Morley Street entrance to Mexico.
